and others, pending in the Supreme Court of the United States, with the documents, be referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

And that so much of the message as relates to an ordinance of the city of Baltimore, passed March 12, 1840, be referred to the

same committee.

Mr. Nesbit obtained leave to bring in a bill to lessen and establish a uniform system of charges, by notaries public, on all protested notes, drafts, bills of exchange, &c;

Ordered, That Messrs. Nesbitt, Gallagher, and E. A. Lynch

report the same.

Mr. Randall (seconded by two other members that voted in the majority) moved to reconsider the vote of the house upon the leave to introduce a bill, confirmatory of an act, entitled an act to alter and amend the constitution, so far as relates to the power of the Legislature to grant lotteries, passed at December session 1839:

Mr. Maccubbin reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid a deed of partition between Zadoch Robinson, and others, of Prince George's county;

Which was read, and

On motion of Mr. Macubbin,

Referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg of Allegany,

The house took up for consideration the resolution submitted by him on yesterday, in relation to the amount due for supplies furnished the troops under the command of Col. C. M. Thurston, when on expedition against the rioters on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany,
