So the bill was passed.

Mr. Thayer, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the senate entitled an act for the opening of a new alley, and for the sale of part of Cherry alley, in the town of Cumberland, reported the same with the following amendments:

Amendments proposed,

Add the following to the 1st section:

And the said alley shall have its outlet to the court house square, across the southwest corner of lot No. sixty-six, for which purpose so much of said lot No. sixty-six as is southwest of a line drawn from a point in its southwest boundary ten feet eastward of the aforesaid southwest corner to a point in its western boundary, then ten feet northward of said northwestern corner shall be laid off for and shall be considered as part of said alley.

Section 4th. And be it enacted, That this act shall be inoperative
