

for supplies furnished the Militia engaged under Col. C. M. Thruston, in suppressing the riots on the line of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal during the preceding summer, and did accompany said report with a resolution directing the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to pay Col. Charles M. Thruston, the sum of four hundred and forty-seven dollars and twenty-one cents, for the purpose mentioned in the report: and whereas by reference to the journal of the house of December session, page 627, it appears that the "resolution in favor of Col. Charles M. Thruston and other," was returned from the senate "assented to and ordered to be engrossed" showing evidently, that the Legislature acknowledged the justice of the said claims and ordered their payment: and whereas the publication of the said resolution has been accidentally omitted by the publisher of the laws of the session aforesaid of the General Assembly—Therefore,

Which was read,

On motion of Mr. Jones, of Somerset,

Said preamble and resolution was laid on the table;

On motion of Mr. Estep,

Ordered, That the committee on claims be directed to pay to J. D. Hare, twenty-five dollars for his services, as serjeant-at-arms during the present session, and charge the same on the journal of accounts.

The Speaker laid before the house a communication from the register of wills, of Prince George's county, relative to the school fund for said county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

The clerk of the senate returned the resolution, in relation to paying the members and officers of the Legislature and the electors of President and Vice President, endorsed, "assented to" and the resolution ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered a report from the President of the board of trustee's of Centreville Academy, in Queen Anne's county, relative to the condition of said academy;

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

The house adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock.
