

The bill, entitled an act supplemental to an act, passed at December session 1837, chapter 284, to open a certain road in St. Mary's county; also

The bill, entitled an act to authorise Thomas Hook, former collector of Carroll county, to complete his collections; also

The bill, entitled an act to regulate the building of wharves on the river Susquehanna; also

The bill, entitled an act to incorporate the Methodist Episcopal Church in Frederick; and

The bill entitled an act to divorce Catharine Peddicord, of Baltimore city, from her husband Joseph Peddicord, a vinculo matrimonii;

Severally endorsed "will pass" and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed; also

The bill, entitled an act to provide for the appointment of a wood-corder, in the town of Port Deposit, in Cecil county; also

The bill, entitled an act to provide for the repairing, or rebuilding, a certain bridge therein mentioned; also

The bill, entitled an act to divorce Mary Dorsey, of Frederick county, from her husband, Benjamin Dorsey, a vinculo matrimonii; also

The bill, entitled an act to authorise Benjamin Silver, former collector of taxes in the secone election district in Harford county, further time to complete his collections; also

The bill entitled an act to authorise Perry G. Hobbs, late collector of Howard District, in Anne Arundel county, further time to complete his collections of county taxes in said district; also

The bill, entitled an act to increase the sheriff's commission for the collection of attorney's and officer's fees in Allegany and Talbot counties; and

The bill, entitled an act for the benefit of William Fowler, sen'r, of Howard District, in Anne Arundel county;

Severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally assented to, and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed; also

The resolution in favor of Somerville Pinkney, and J. J. Loyd;

Endorsed, "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the Senate, viz.

A bill, entitled an act relating to the school fund of Cecil county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Maxwell, Morton and Simcoe.

A bill, entitled an act to authorise the commissioners of Cecil county, at their discretion, to levy a sum of money to build a bridge over the east branch of North East creek, near John Meame's saw mill, on the public road leading from the Brick Meeting-house and Rock Meeting-house, to Northeast village;
