

Endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were severally read the first and by a special order the second time;

Mr. Shower moved to amend the 3rd amendment, by adding at the end thereof the following: "and that the office of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, be not removed west of Frederick,"

Which was read;

Mr. Tuck rose to a point of order, that the amendment being a subject different to the one under consideration, it was not in order; The chair decided the amendment to be out of order.

The said amendment was then assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered the following bills originated in and passed by the Senate, viz.

A bill, entitled an act to authorise Henry P. Norris, to have recorded the name of a certain negro brought into this State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on colored population.

A bill, entitled an act to incorporate the trustees of Washington Academy, in Cecil county;

A bill, entitled an act to incorporate the trustees of the Grove School House in Cecil county;

A bill, entitled an act to incorporate the trustees of the Franklin School House in Cecil county;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on corporations.

And the following message:

*By the Senate,*

February 26, 1841.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:*

We herewith return to you the bill, entitled an act to prohibit any corporation, or individuals, or association of individuals, from issuing any paper intended to circulate as money or currency, as requested by you in a message received some days since.

Which was read.

Mr. Graves moved to suspend the rule of the house, to enable him to move to reconsider the bill, entitled an act to prohibit any corporation, or individual, or association of individuals, from issuing any paper, intended to circulate as money or currency;

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

The house then reconsidered their vote on said bill.

On motion of Mr. Le Grand,

Said bill was recommitted.
