On motion of Mr. Heard.

Ordered, That the petition of Teresa Hays, of St. Mary's county, praying to have the pension of her late husband, John H. Hays, a soldier of the revolution, continued to her, be withdrawn from the files of this house, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. E. A. Lynch obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled an act to alter and regulate the mode of appointing Lottery Commissioners in

this State,

Which was read and referred to the committee on lotteries.

Mr. Tuck asked and obtained the following leave:

Leave to bring in a bill, entitled an act to repeal the act of 1832, chapter 230;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and

courts of justice.

On motion of Mr. England,

Ordered, That the committee on claims pay to Levin H. Broadwater such sum of money as he may be entitled to as the bearer of the joint letter to the Hon. John Leeds Kerr, informing him of his election as United States Senator.

On motion of Mr. Nicols,

Ordered, That this house will proceed to the appointment of a Treasurer for the Eastern Shore on Wednesday next, at 12 o'clock.

On motion of Mr. Gaither,

Ordered, That the committee on colored population be instructed to enquire of the Board of Managers of the Maryland State Colonization Society, the number of negroes which have been liberated in each county of the State, by last wills and testaments, or by deeds of manumission, since 1831; also the number which have been sent to their colony on the coast of Africa; and also the number which they have caused to be sent out of the State under the provisions of the act of 1831, ch. 281.

On motion of Mr. Edward A. Lynch,

Seconded by two other members that voted in the majority, the house reconsidered their vote upon the reference of the leave to introduce a bill to alter and regulate the mode of appointing lottery commissioners in this State.

On motion of Mr. E. A. Lynch,

Said leave was referred to a select committee composed of Messrs. E. A. Lynch, Matthews, Heard, Gallagher, and Ford.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany,

The house took up for consideration the preamble and resolution submitted by him on the 1st instant, in relation to the amount due for supplies furnished the troops under the command of Col. C. M. Thruston, when on an expedition against the rioters on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal;
