

And the preamble and resolutions in relation to the repeal of the Sub-Treasury law;

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and the resolutions severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also the resolutions in favor of Catharine Myer, Hannah Adams, Mary Allen and Teresa Hays, severally endorsed "dissented from;"

And delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the Senate:

A bill, entitled an act to authorise John Godwin to have recorded the name of a certain negro woman;

A bill, entitled a supplement to the act, entitled an act to encourage the emigration of the free people of color, passed at December session 1839, ch. 5, so far as relates to Baltimore county;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on colored population;

A bill, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to record and make valid a deed therein mentioned, passed at December session 1839, ch. 244;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

A bill, entitled an act to preserve the ducks in Bush and Gunpowder rivers;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Sutton, Billingslea, Hope, Holmes, and Welsh of Baltimore county.

A bill, entitled an act to quiet possessions, confirm titles, and make valid certain proceedings in chancery;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

And a resolution appointing the agents to represent the State in all joint stock companies in which the State has an interest;

Which was read; and

On motion of Mr. Jones, of Somerset,

Laid on the table.

Mr. Billingslea submitted the following message; which was read, assented to; and with the bill therein mentioned, sent to the senate:
