On the question being put, will the house concur in the unfavorable report of the committee on lotteries, recommending the rejection of said bill? it was

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put upon the passage of the bill; and

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Graves called for the yess and nays;

Which call was not sustained by the house.

The said bill was then returned to the senate.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, from the joint committee appointed under resolution No. 8, of the present session, to examine, count and burn the 6 per cent. dollar bonds of the State, and to examine the proceedings and documents of the Commissioner of Loans, delivered a report;

Which was read; and

On motion of Mr. Jones, of Somerset,

Three hundred and thirty-three copies ordered to be printed.

Mr. Hearn reported a bill, entitled a further supplement to an act, entitled an act to authorise the appointment of commissioners, and the division of Worcester county into school districts, and for other purposes, passed at December session 1838, ch. 371;

Mr. Sutton reported a bill, entitled a supplement to the act relating to the lien of mechanics and others upon buildings, passed at December session 1838, ch. 205;

Mr. Whiteford reported a bill, entitled an act for the benefit of James Whiteford, late collector of Harford county; and

Mr. Gantt reported a bill, entitled an act to change the place of holding the election in the fourth election district in Anne Arundel county;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Holmes reported a bill, entitled an act to repair injuries done on the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
