

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State will accept the piece of ordnance presented by the Rev. Jos. Carbury, and that his Excellency the Governor, be requested to communicate this resolution to him, and cause the same to be transported to the seat of Government, and placed at some suitable place wishin the entrance Hall of the State House, and to draw on the Treasury for such amount as may be necessary to defray the expenses thereof.
