

Mr. England reported a bill, entitled an act to authorise the trustees of St. Marie's Church, at Rockville, to convey the same and for other purposes; and

Mr. Maxwell reported a bill, entitled an act to provide for the inspection of staves and headings in Port Deposit town, in Cecil county;

Which were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Nesbitt, chairman of the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled an act for the benefit of the Hagerstown Charity School;

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the second time by a special order, passed, and returned to the senate.

Mr. Le Grand, chairman of the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled an act relating to the removal of criminal cases from Baltimore city court;

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the second time by a special order, passed, and returned to the senate.

Mr. Weast reported a bill, entitled an act to authorise the incorporated banks of this state, out of the city of Baltimore, to issue small notes for a limited time;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, from the committee on ways and means, to which was referred the amendments proposed by the senate to the bill reported by Mr. Gallagher, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to vest certain powers in the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, passed at December session 1838, ch. 414, asked that said committee be discharged from the further consideration thereof;

On the question being put on discharging the committee; it was Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

The house took up for consideration the report submitted by him on the 19th February, from the joint committee on the state library;

On motion of Mr. Orrick,

The second resolution in said report was amended, by inserting after the word "state," the words "and the several incorporated academies in this state;" and at the end of said resolution, by adding the following: "and one copy to each member of the present Legislature."

Mr. Randall moved further to amend said resolutions, by striking out, in the third resolution, the words "forty-four," and inserting in lieu thereof "six;"

Determined in the negative.

The said report and resolutions were then read the second time
