Also, the bill, entitled an act to extend the time to enable John S. Crockett, late sheriff and collector of Somerset county, to complete his collections;

Also, the bill, entitled a further supplement to an act, entitled an act to authorise the appointment of commissioners and the division of Worcester county into school districts, and for other purposes passed at December session 1838, ch. 371;

Also, the bill, entitled an act to incorporate the St. Joseph's Beneficial Society of Baltimore;

Also, the bill, entitled an act for the relief of Thomas Ayres, of Frederick county;

And, the bill, entitled an act for the relief of Stump & Jackson, of Harford county;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the resolution directing the Adjutant General to furnish Capt. George R. Howard, with a certain number of knapsacks;

Also, the resolution relative to a piece of ordnance presented by Rev. John Carberry;

And, the resolution in relation to the ground rent upon the State Tobacco Warehouses, Nos. 3 and 4;

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and severally ordered to be engrossed.
