sented to the last House of Delegates, praying for the confirmation

of certain deeds therein mentioned.

Mr. Edward A. Lynch obtained leave to bring in a bill to revive the act of Assembly, passed at December session 1834, with certain limitations to the same.

Ordered, That Messrs. E. A. Lynch, Nesbit, Wm. Lynch, Brent

and England report the same.

Mr. Le Grand obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Potomac Steam Packet Company, passed December session 1828, chapter 183;

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Ordered, That the Treasurer report to this house the "account of the Legislature" for the years ending 1st December, 1838, 1839, 1840, and the amount paid for public printing to the same date or same years.

On motion of Mr. Jones, of Somerset,

Ordered, That the committee on claims, allow to Levin Broadwater, the messenger employed to convey to the Hon. John Leeds Kerr, the notification of his election as U. S. Senator, the sum of twenty-five dollars in addition to the sum of thirty-one dollars, which they have already allowed him, as a compensation for his services.

Mr. Lecompte submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the clerks of the several county courts of this State, shall furnish to every person named as justice of the peace, in the commission of the Governor, a copy of the laws, and of the votes and proceedings, whether the person so named shall have qualified as such or not;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Gott reported a bill, entitled an act to authorise the Orphans' court of Montgomery county, to permit Eleanor Chiswell, widow of John A. Chiswell, deceased, to erect a dwelling house on the real estate of said Chiswell; and

Mr. Shower reported a bill, entitled an act to survey and locate

the North East line between Baltimore and Carroll counties;

Which were severally read the first and by a special order the sec-

ond time, severally passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled an act to extend the act to allow Henry L. Coombs, late collector of Prince George's county, further time to complete his collections;

Endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment,"

Which amendment was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed:

And the resolution, requesting His Excellency, the Governor, to issue a commission to the Hon. John Leeds Kerr, as Senator from this State, to the Congress of the United States;

Endorsed, assented to and ordered to be engrossed;
