Mr. Frazier, chairman of the committee on divorces, reported a a bill, entitled an act to divorce Hannah C. Pierce, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband, Alfred Pierce;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time,

passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Heard, chairman of the committee on the militia, to which was referred the petition of Benjamin Chesney and others, praying compensation for military services, and that an enquiry may be instituted into the conduct of Col. John Budd, of the 42nd Regiment Maryland Militia, as regards the disbursement of the money heretofore appropriated for said services; asked to be discharged from the further consideration of the same, and that it be referred to the consideration of the Governor of this State;

Mr. Heard, chairman of same committee, to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled an act supplementary to the several militia laws of this State, reported the same with the following amendment:
