

The said bill was then read the second time, by a special order, passed, with the proposed amendment and returned to the senate.

Mr. Gaither, chairman of the committee on elections and privileges, submitted the following resolutions:

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the State Librarian, be and he is hereby authorised and required to prepare and cause to be re-printed a compilation of the election laws now in force in this State and have 500 copies thereof printed, and that the same be distributed, among the counties and cities in this State, so that the judges of election for each district shall receive one copy thereof;

*Resolved,* That the clerks of the several county courts shall, under the penalty of fifty dollars, deliver to the sheriffs of their respective counties, immediately preceding each election, the said compilation of the election laws, whose duty it shall be under the like penalty, during the week preceding each election, to leave one copy thereof at the place of holding elections in each election district, for the use of the judges thereof:

*Resolved* That it shall be the duty of the returning judge of each election district, at the time of making returns of any election, to deposit said compilation of the election laws in the office of the clerks of the several county courts, to be by them safely kept in their respective offices, until the same be required for further use;

Which were read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Lecompte, from the committee on corporations, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled an act to incorporate the trustees of Bethel School House, in Cecil county; and

Mr. Causin, chairman of the committee on corporations, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled an act to incorporate "the Wallgrove Manufacturing Company;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. E. A. Lynch submitted the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the senate;

*By the House of Delegates:*

March 10, 1841.

*Gentlemen of the Senate:*

We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body, to close the present session of the legislature by adjournment sine die, this afternoon, at nine o'clock, and with that view respectfully propose that his Excellency, the Governor, be requested to attend in the senate chamber, at 9 o'clock, for the purpose of signing the engrossed bills of this session.
