Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and

courts of justice.

Mr. Gantt presented the petition of Hamilton P. Moss, praying to be allowed to bring into this State, two negroes from the State of

Which was read and referred to the committee on colored popu-

lation.

Mr. Edward A. Lynch presented a report of the visitors of St. John's Literary Institution of Frederick city;

Which was read and referred to the committee on education,

Mr. Causin asked and obtained the following leave:

Leave to introduce a bill, to be entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to incorporate the trustees of the poor of Baltimore city, and limits;

Mr. Le Grand moved that said leave be referred to a select committee, composed of the delegations from Baltimore city and county; Mr. Causin moved that said leave be referred to the committee on

corporations;

Determined in the negative;

The question then recurred and was put upon the motion of Mr. Le Grand, to refer said leave to the delegations of Baltimore city and county; and

Resolved in the affirmative. On motion of Mr. Gantt.

Ordered, That the Geologist of this State, be directed to make his report as early as practicable;

Mr. Holmes submitted the following order;

Ordered, That his Excellency the Governor, be respectfully requested to cause the national flag to be displayed from the top of the State House steeple, on Friday the 8th of January, in commemoration of the victory achieved by the American forces commanded by General Jackson, over the British forces on the 8th of January 1815;

Which was twice read.

Mr. Causin moved to lay said order on the table,

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Gantt (seconded by two other members that voted in the majority) moved that the house reconsider their vote upon the leave asked by Mr. Causin, to introduce a bill, to be entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to incorporate the trustees of the poor of Baltimore city and limits, referring said leave to a select committee composed of the delegations of Baltimore county and city;
