Leave was granted the committee on corporations to prepare and report a bill, entitled an act to incorporate the Library Company of the Baltimore Bar.

Mr. Stull obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled an act to incorporate the United Seminary in Carroll county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Stull, Boyle and Shower report the same.

Mr. Causin presented the memorial of M. Duvall, relative to his claim against the Eastern Shore Rail Road Company;

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Zeigler obtained leave to bring in a bill to change the name of Isaac Smith to that of Isaac Smith Clayton, of Washington county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Zeigler, Nesbit and Weast report the same.

On motion of Mr. Nesbit,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of this house, the petition of the Hagerstown Bank and accompanying papers, praying for a recharter.

Mr. Sprigg of Allegany, submitted the following resolution:
