194 An act further to extend the time allowed Thomas M. D. Baden, collector of taxes of Prince George's county, to complete his collections.

195 An act to make public a road therein mentioned.

196 An act, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to establish a uniform system of charges, by notary publics in this state, passed at the present session, ch. 92, so far as the same extends to Talbot county.

197 An act to provide for the repairs of the public roads of Calvert county.

198 An act to incorporate the Franklin Beneficial Total Abstinence Society of Baltimore.

199 An act for the benefit of Lewis N. Sewell, collector of taxes for the city of Annapolis, and collector of taxes for the fourth collection district of Anne Arundel county.

200 An act relating to the Corporation of the city of Baltimore.

201 An act, entitled an act to authorise and require the commissioners of Cecil county to levy a sum of money to rebuild a bridge over Principio creek, in said county.

202 A supplement to an act, entitled an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this state, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed at December session 1835.

203 An act to divorce Sarah Martin, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband, William Martin.

204 A supplement to the act, entitled an act to alter the mode of appointing the levy court of Kent county, to provide for their election by the people, and to abolish the board of commissioners of tax in said county, passed at December session 1838, ch. 305.

205 An act to divorce Sarah Ann McCoy, of Washington county, from her husband, George Valentine McCoy.

206 An act for the better regulating the harbor and port of Baltimore.

207 An act to incorporate the Eastern Hotel Company of Cumberland, in the town of Cumberland.

208 A supplement to the act, entitled an act to encourage the emigration of the free people of color, passed at December session 1839, ch. 5, so far as relates to Baltimore county.

209 An act to authorise John B. Wells to bring his negro slaves into this state.

210 An act for the benefit of the Hagerstown Charity School.

211 An act relating to the removal of criminal cases from Baltimore city court.

212 An act in respect to insurances for lives for the benefit of married woman.

213 An act for the benefit of John Busk and Harriet Josephine Busk, his wife, of the city of Baltimore.
