Mr. Hearn moved to lay said resolution and substitutes on the table,

Resolved in the affirmative

Ordered, That it shall not be in order for any member of the house to move in any form to have entered on the journal his reasons for any vote;

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

Ordered, That the committee of ways and means, be and it is hereby authorised to send for persons and papers in relation to any matter of finance which may come before them;

On motion of Mr. Gaither,

The house resumed the consideration of the unfinished business of Wednesday, being the resolutions submitted by him on the 30th ultimo, in relation to the proposition so to alter the constitution of the United States, as to limit the Presidential service to one term, lately made in the senate of the United States; the amendment offered by Mr. Le Grand to said resolutions; and the substitute offered by Mr. Tuck, for said resolutions and amendment;

The question before the house being upon the substitute offered by Mr. Tuck,

Mr. Le Grand, by permission of the house, withdrew his amendment;

Mr. Tuck, by permission of the house, withdrew his substitute;

After some debate thereon,

Mr. Seidenstricker moved to lay the resolution on the table,

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Lyuch moved that the house adjourn,

Resolved in the affirmative,

And the house accordingly adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
