

Amendments proposed.

Strike out all after the enacting clause, and insert:

"That Thomas Baldwin, former sheriff of Prince George's county, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to collect all fees that may yet be due him as sheriff as aforesaid, in the manner now allowed by law; Provided, that he shall, in every case, before he proceeds to execute for any of said fees, make out a fair account thereof, with an affidavit annexed, that they are due, and that he has not received, or any other person for him, any part of the same.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall continue in force until the first day of January, 1842, and no longer."

Which were read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Tuck, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made a favorable report upon the bill reported by Mr. Maccubbin, entitled an act to make valid a deed of partition between Zadoch Robinson and others, of Prince George's county;

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Frazier, chairman of the committee on divorces, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Elizabeth Hubbard, praying for a divorce from her husband, Edward Hubbard;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and concurred in.

Mr. Coombs, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled an act to provide for the assessment and valuation of all the real and personal property in Allegany county, reported the same with the following amendments:

Insert, in the first line of the 2d section, "Martin Rizer, jun. and William Shaw."

Strike out the 16th section.

Section 17, strike out "17," and insert "16."

Section 18, strike out "18," and insert "17."

Which amendments were read.

The said bill was then read the first, and by special order the second time, with the amendments.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany,

Said bill and amendments were laid on the table.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled an act to incorporate the Library Company of the Baltimore Bar, endorsed "will pass," and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

Also the bill, entitled an act to survey and locate the northeast line between Baltimore and Carroll counties, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;"

Which amendment was read the first, and by a special order the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Nicols submitted the following order; which was twice read and adopted:

Ordered, That a committee of seven be appointed by the chair,
