Vaughan from her husband, John Vaughan, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and the bill placed in the hands of the Speaker;

Mr. Causin moved that said bill be withdrawn from the hands of

the chair for the purpose of moving to recommit the same;

Determined in the affirmative. On motion of Mr. Causin,

Said bill was then recommitted, with the following instructions:

That the report of the committee on divorces, upon the petition of Charlotte A. Vaughan, be recommitted with instructions to examine into the allegations of the petitions and to notify the party applying, that they will receive no evidence upon the facts stated, except such as is taken under the forms of the laws of such States as the witnesses examined may be inhabitants of.

The house then proceeded to consider the order of the day, being the bill reported by Mr. Gantt, entitled an act to authorise the banks of the State of Maryland, to receive and pay out the orders drawn by the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, on the stock of the city

of Baltimore;

Mr. Gantt moved that said bill be postponed until to-morrow,

Mr. Bowie moved that said bill be referred to the committee on ways and means:

Mr. Causin moved that said bill be postponed and made the order of the day for Thursday next, the 14th instant:

Determined in the affirmative.

The clerk of the senate returned the resolution in favor of Col. C. M. Thruston; and

The resolution relative to the distribution of the laws and votes and receedings:

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and severally ordered to be en-

grossed; also,

The resolution granting the armorer at Annapolis and messenger to the Governor, the use of the State Library;

Endorsed, assented to with the proposed amendment,"

Which amendment was read the first and second time by special order, "assented to, and the resolution ordered to be engrossed;"

And, delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the

senate, viz:

A bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to amend the constitution and form of government, so far as relates to the division of Allegany county, into election districts, and to establish an additional election district;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Sprigg of Allegany,

Thaver, and Coombs.

A bill, entitled an act to make valid the sale therein mentioned; Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice;
