Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time,

severally passed and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany,

The house took up for consideration the bill from the senate, entitled an act to provide for the assessment and valuation of all the real and personal property in Allegany county, and the amendments reported thereto from the committee;

The amendments having been read the second time were assented

to

The said bill was then read as amended, passed and returned to the senate

The house then took up for consideratioe the order submitted by Mr. Tuck, on the 8th inst., "That it should not be in order for any member of the house to move in any form to have entered on the journal his reasons for any vote."

The said order was then read the second time and adopted.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day, the house proceeded to consider the bill reported by Mr. E. A. Lynch, entitled an act to alter and regulate the mode of appointing lottery commissioners in this State;

On motion of Mr. Gantt.

Said bill was referred to the committee on lotteries.

On motion of Mr. Tuck.

Leave was granted the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to prepare and report a bill, entitled a supplement to the act passed at December session 1813, chapter 102, entitled, an act relating to sheriffs and for other purposes.

On motion of Mr. Tuck.

The said bill was then read the second time by a special order and passed.
