

The bill reported by Mr. William Lynch, entitled a further supplement to an act, entitled an act to blend Newtown Trap and New Freedom, in Frederick county, into one, by the name of Jefferson, passed December session 1831, ch. 299,

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Poultney obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled an act relating to rail roads;

Ordered, That Messrs. Poultney, Hooper and Tuck report the same.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day, the house proceeded to consider the bill reported by Mr. Gantt, entitled an act to authorise the Banks of the State of Maryland to receive and pay out the orders drawn by the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company on the stock of the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Gantt moved that said bill be postponed until Wednesday next, the 20th inst.

Mr. E. A. Lynch moved that said bill be postponed until the 1st Monday of February next.

Mr. Tuck moved that said bill be postponed until Tuesday, the 26th inst.

The question was first put on the motion of Mr. E. A. Lynch, (being the longest time,) to postpone the bill until the 1st Monday in February; and

Determined in the negative.

The question was then put on the motion of Mr. Tuck, to postpone the bill until the 26th instant; and

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put upon the motion of Mr. Gantt, to postpone said bill until Wednesday nex; and

Resolved in the affirmative.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled an act to change the names of John Henry Alvey, Ann Maria Alvey, and James Chapman Alvey, the children of Mrs. Ann McPherson Alvey, of St. Mary's county, to those of John Henry Cook, Ann Maria Cook and James Chapman Cook;

Endorsed, "will pass," and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered the following bills originated in and passed by the senate, viz :

A bill entitled an act supplemental to the act, entitled an act concerning crimes and punishments, passed at November session 1809, chapter 138;

Which was read and referred to the committee on crimes and punishments.

A bill entitled an act to enlarge the power of courts of equity;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.
