Referred to the committee on corporations,

Mr. Tuck, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, reported a bill entitled a supplement to the act passed at December session 1813, chapter 102, entitled an act relating to sheriffs and for other purposes;

Mr. Forman reported a bill entitled an additional supplement to the act entitled an act to incorporate the Buckingham Academy, in Worcester county, passed at December session 1813, chapter 13;

and

Mr. Nesbitt reported a bill entitled an act to abolish magistrates' courts within this State, and to extend the jurisdiction of single justices in certain cases;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the

table.

Mr. Graves submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the Presidents or Cashiers of the several Banks in the city of Baltimore, be requested to submit any communication they may have received concerning the resumption of specie payments, from the Banks of other States, or from members of this Legislature.

Which was twice read.

Mr. Gaither moved that said order be rejected;

Resolved in the affirmative.
