TUESDAY, APRIL 6, 1841.

The house met. Present at the call of the roll, the following members:

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The Speaker announced the following message as having been received from the Senate on yesterday:

The bill, entitled an act for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland;

Also the bill, entitled an act for the relief of sundry poor persons of the several counties therein mentioned;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also the resolution in favor of Margaret King, endorsed "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed;

And the resolution in favor of Mary Butler, endorsed "dissented from."

Mr. Jones of Somersét, reported a bill, entitled a further supplement to an act to prevent the destruction of oysters in the waters of this State, passed at December session 1833, ch. 254;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the memorial of Fleet C. Chelton, of Somerset county, praying further compensation for work and labor done on the Eastern Shore Rail Road, and for other purposes, reported that the committee had not had time to give the same the consideration it required, and therefore begged to be discharged from its further consideration, and that the same be referred to the consideration of the next General Assembly;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, and concurred in.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, chairman of the select committee, delivered the following report:
