Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioner of Loans of this State be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, immediately to issue and deliver to William W. Johnston, of Somerset county, a certificate of debt of the State of Maryland, to the amount of forty dollars, bearing an interest of six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, at the loan office in the city of Baltimore, and to be redeemable in fifty years from the date thereof; the same being the sum allowed him by the Board of Commissioners to settle up the affairs of the Eastern Shore Rail Road Company, for damages to the land of said Johnston, by the construction of said road through it, and omitted by the said Board of Commissioners to be included in their award in favor of said Johnston.

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the Senate.
