Also the bill, entitled an act to abolish magistrates' courts in Montgomery county, and to extend the jurisdiction of single justices in said county;

Also the bill, entitled an act to make valid a deed therein mentioned;

Also the bill, entitled an act to authorise the primary school commissioners of Queen Anne's county, to organise and establish new districts in said county; endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;"
