

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled a supplement to an act to incorporate the Jennings' Valley Rail Road and Turnpike Road Company, endorsed "will not pass;"

Also the bill, entitled an act for the relief of counter securities of executors and administrators;

Also the bill, entitled a further supplement to an act passed at December session '1823, ch. 21, entitled an act to abolish the levy court of Anne Arundel county, and for other purposes;

Also the bill, entitled an act to provide for the appointment of a flour inspector and an inspector of shingles in Havre de Grace;

Severally endorsed "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also the resolution in relation to the claim of this State against the United States, endorsed "assented to," and the resolution ordered to be engrossed;

Also the resolution in favor of William W. Johnston, endorsed "dissented from;"

And delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled an act to abolish magistrates' courts, and to extend the jurisdiction of single justices in certain cases, so far as relates to Washington and Caroline counties;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Nesbitt, Weast and Nicols;

And the following message:

Mr. Nicols submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Rev. Mr. Furlong twenty five dollars, for compensation for his services as chaplain to the House of Delegates, at the present session.

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to such members of the General Assembly as may be necessarily detained at the Seat of Government by indisposition, the usual per diem allowance during such detention.
