Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to vest certain powers in the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, passed at December session 1838, ch. 414, was taken up for consideration, and read the second time.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, called for the previous question, that is, shall the main question be now put? and it was.
