The joint committee on printing beg leave to make the following report:

The committee have contracted for the printing of the next session of the General Assembly as follows: with Jeremiah Hughes for all the printing that may be required by the House of Delegates, on the following terms:

1600 copies of the Journal, at \$2 per page, of 1,450 m's, each.

Bills, 111 copies, at \$1 per page, of 22 lines, of 6 inches length.

Pamphlets and reports, 111 copies, at \$1 per page, of 1450 m's.

Tabular pages double the above rates.

Index to the Journal \$150.

The committee have also contracted with William McNier, for all the printing that may be required by the Senate and for the laws, as follows:

1600 copies of Journal, at \$2 per page, of 1,450 m's.

Bills, 111 copies, at \$1 per page, of 22 lines, 6 inches.

Pamphlets and reports, 111 copies, at \$1 per page, of 1,450 m's,

Tabular pages, double the above rates.

1600 copies of laws, at \$2 50 per page, of 1650 m's each.

Index to the Laws \$150; index to the Journal \$100.

The paper, type, and execution of the work, to be equal to the last or any previous session.
