Mr. Gaither submitted the following resolution:

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be and he is hereby directed to pay out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, to Joseph H. Nicholson, or order, one hundred and fifty dollars as compensation in full for procuring copies of the certificates and accompanying papers of the Electors of President and Vice President of the United States for the State of Maryland, from the year 1789 to the year 1828, inclusive, and for recording the same, together with the proceedings of the said electors for the years 1832, 1836 and 1840, agreeably to the directions contained in the preamble and resolutions of the General Assembly of Maryland, of December session, 1840;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time;

On motion of Mr. Nicols,

Said resolution was amended by striking out the words "and fifty;"

The said resolution was then assented to as amended and sent to the senate.

Mr. Nesbitt submitted the following resolution:

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the chief clerk of the House of Delegates, be and he is hereby authorised to cause to be published the act passed at December session 1840, entitled "an act regulating the licenses of hawkers and pedlars," in such newspapers within this State, as he may direct, not to exceed more than one paper in each county, and the city of Baltimore, and not to be published more than once a week for three successive weeks, and that the Treasurer of the Western Shore be required to pay for the same;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and rejected.

On motion of Mr. Maxwell,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the house two petitions counter to the petition for opening a road in Cecil county.

On motion of Mr. Causin,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the house the petition and papers of Mrs. Barbara Riley.
