certificates and accompanying papers of the Electors of President

and Vice President of the United States from 1789 to 1840.

Upon enquiry we find that the actual expense incurred by him was nearly that sum. We respectfully submit that the sum of \$150 is not more than an adequate compensation for the services which was required of him, and request you, as an act of justice, to pass another resolution giving him fifty dollars more.
