

Mr. Tuck submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That resolution passed at December session 1839, numbered 47, providing for a classification of the laws, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to and, sent to the senate.

Mr. Parsons, from the select committee, to which was referred the petition of Caleb Kennerly and others, praying for an appropriation, out of the school fund for Somerset county, reported that an act has been reported at the present session to amend the school law of Somerset county, which it is hoped will accomplish the purposes and wishes of the petitioners;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and concurred in.

Mr. Le Grand reported a bill, entitled an act to change the name of Benedict Arnold, of the city of Baltimore, to George William Arnold;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Gallagher reported a bill, entitled an act to incorporate the Mount Clare Total Abstinence Society of Baltimore;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Graves moved to suspend the rule of the house requiring two-thirds, and take up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled an act to prohibit any corporation, or individual, or association of individuals, from issuing any paper, intended to circulate as money or currency;

Determined in the negative.
