

The said bill was then read the first and by a special order the second time and passed.

Mr. Tall, from the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled a supplement to an act in aid of the construction of a stone, or other wharf, at Cambridge, in Dorchester county. passed at December session 1839, chapter 246;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The house then resumed the consideration of the bill reported by Mr. Bowie, chairman of the committee on ways and means, entitled an act for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, and to provide a tax to pay the debts of the State;

The question before the house being upon the motion of Mr. Martin, to strike out the 32d section of the bill and substitute therefor the section offered by him this morning,

On the question being put on striking out, it was
