WEDNESDAY, MARCH 31, 1841.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Jones of Kent, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Kent county, praying the passage of a law to impose a tax on dogs in this State and for other purposes;

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Seidenstricker presented the petition of William Caldwell, praying for an alteration of his name to William Quarll Caldwell;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Seidenstricker, Le Grand, Graves, Gallagher, and Presstman.

Mr. Seidenstricker also presented the petition of John W. Stump and others, merchants of the city of Baltimore, praying for an alteration in the laws relating to the inspection of fish;

Which was read and referred to the committee on inspections.

Mr. Presstman presented the petition of Anthony Nagle, of Baltimore county, praying for relief therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Weast presented the petition of 145 citizens of Washington county, praying the passage of a law authorising the banks to issue small notes;

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.
