The question then recurred and was put upon concurring in the unfavorable report of the committee; and

Resolved in the affirmative. On motion of Mr. Fraizer,

The house took up for consideration the bill from the senate, entitled a supplement to an act in aid of the construction of a stone or other wharf at Cambridge, in Dorchester county, passed at December session 1839, ch. 246.

The said bill was then read the second time, and placed in the

hands of the chair.

Mr. Martin called for the previous question (which being demanded by a majority of the members present.) the said previous question was put, that is, shall the main question be now put? and it was

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Causin called for the reading of a message which had been received from the Senate, and was upon the desk of the Speaker.

The following message was then read:

By the Senate, March 30th, 1841.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

The Senate yesterday inadvertently passed a bill, entitled a supplement to the act in aid of the construction of a stone or other wharf at Cambridge, in Dorchester county, passed December se sion 1839, ch. 246, and would respectfully ask that the said bill be returned to the Senate.

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal im-

provements.

A bill, entitled an act to divorce Michael Byers, of Carroll county, from his wife, Genetta Byers; and

A bill, entitled an act to divorce Henry White of Joseph, of Som-

erset county, from his wife, Esther White;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on divorces.
