The house then resumed the consideration of the bill from the Senate, entitled a supplement to an act in aid of the construction of a stone or other wharf at Cambridge, in Dorchester county, passed at December session 1839, ch. 246.

The call for the previous question on said bill having been sus-

ained by the house,

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass?

Resolved in the affirmative.
