Sec. 12. And be it enacted, That no part of this bill shall be opeative until one or more of the incorporated coal and iron companies in Allegany county, shall have entered into bonds with security to the State of Maryland, to be approved by the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to pay two hundred thousand dollars per annum for five years for the transportation of their own coal, iron or other minerals, or goods, at the expiration of each and every year, from and after six months after the completion of said canal to Cumberland; provided, that nothing herein contained, shall be construed to exonerate or release the said companies or owners, or pro rietors from the payment of the full regular charge of tolls upon the whole amount of articles transported by them, whenever the same shall, at the rates of toll charged, or to be charged, by the canal company, exceed in cost the aforesaid sum of two hundred thousand dollars.

Sec. 13. And be it enacted, That the Attorney General of this State is hereby required to institute proceedings to foreclose the mortgages and enforce the liens and pledges, which the State now holds, on the revenues, profits, tolls and properties of said company, which have been made and executed under and by virtue of existing acts of Assembly.
