anno Domini 1695. This Day appeared Rowland Beabine

Report of & concerning the sd Kings Land, and whether
that one John Parker of this County hath made any inclosure
or built within the sd Kings bounds or not. And the
said Rowland Beabine said Junor with y^e Robert Smith
doe Report & say to the Worth Court, that in obedience to the
fores^d Order of Court they have inspected into the sd King
Daniels Land, & have rightly found out the limits and
bounds, & doe find that the sd John Parker hath built
nigh half a mile within the sd Kings Land & bounds
Whereupon this Court having well Considered y^e premises
doe Order that the sd John Parker from hence forward
whely desist from any further proceeding or building upon
the fores^d King Daniels Land: the matter thereon consisting
of the Peace & Welfare of this Province. 73
