And the day (viz) the day aforesaid came the Jurors of the afo-
resaid Jury on tryall before our Sovereign Lord the King and the sd.
John Taylor, where the Jury being particularly called, being then
demanded were all unanimously agreed of their Verdict, the sd.
Dd. Wife like wife being called, the Verdict is read in Court as followeth
(viz) Wee of the Jury do find John Taylor guilty in offering
Violence to Elizabeth Cowin. John Porter. Foreman.
Wherefore Verdict the Court ordered to be entered,
Likewise the sd Court further ordered the said Jury to enquire
into what damages the sd Eliz had sustained by the sd Taylor
whereto the Jury were by Virtue of a Order afd. sworn to enquire the
same the same day ad afd the sd Jury of enquiry made returned
of their Verdict being all agreed thereon the sd Dd. Wife being
called the Verdict is thus read (viz) Wee of the Jury do value the
damages of Elizabeth Cowin one thousand pounds of lawfull.

Whereupon the Court gave Order afd the sd Taylor accordingly
(viz) that he the sd Taylor should pay unto Eliz Cowin one
thousand pounds of lawfull with Cost alias Exorbitio.

James Gray the Wife made Cate in open Court before us
Samm. Hopkine that they attended as witnesses for the King afd
John Taylor the aforesaid Order for the same was granted for four
dayes a piece viz. the 11. 12. 13. 14.

Robert Poulton made Cate that he attended four dayes as Evid
for the King afd John Taylor the aforesaid Order for the same was granted
sworn before James Remond.

Moreover that the day viz the 27. day of January 1695 Capt.
Wm Coulbourn made Cate upon the holy Evangelists that he attended
four dayes the Wife four dayes as Evid on behalf of our Sovereign
the King afd John Taylor. Sworn before the Court viz
The Dixon.

Anni 1695 Corne West says and testifies that Nathaniel Hooper
was sworn before us the 30th day of this Instant to six dayes
bonded in an action depending between us James Remond and
John Poor as Witness my hand the 7. year and day above expressed.
