To the W^{or}th Justice of the Peace for Somerset County in Court sitting
The humble Petition of Thomas Dixon shewing that
the estate of Philip Thomas stood justly indebted unto the Petitioner
the sum of seven hundred & sixty pounds of tobacco. And likewise
the estate of John Long stood indebted to the Petitioner the sum of five
hundred twenty four pounds of tobacco all which the Petitioner prays
Order for as yet & demand. And as in duty bound shall pray. &c.

The Petition being read, John Long the debtor of the former standing in open
Court confessed judgment to the Petitioner for five hundred & twenty four pounds
of tobacco for which the Court grants Order for the Petitioner to execute.

The aforesaid Petition being read Thomas Thomas Debtor of Philip Thomas
this day in open Court confessed judgment to the Petitioner for the former seven
hundred & sixty pounds of tobacco. For which the Court grants order for the Petitioner to execute.

His Matie's Contr. In Fyne The Defendant this day appearing, and also James Jones
and his wife Jane made Oath in Open Court that he is
said Fyne was the father of her bastard Child.

Whereupon it was considered & ordered that the said Fyne
do pay to the said James five hundred pounds of tobacco for the time past for
maintaining the said bastard Child, & further ordered that the said Fyne do write
the said Child & it to take care & provide for so that the County thereby be no
ways damaged, & that he give good security for the same & for his good
behaviour. Whereupon came the said Fyne & his security Charles Mullon
and the said Fyne & Mullon did assign the influence jointly & severally to be indebted
unto our Sovereign Lord the King his Heirs & Successors the sum of five hundred
pounds of tobacco a piece, due to be levied out of his goods & Chattels lands & tenements
for the Matie's use & service.
