 October Anno Domini 1696.

The Condition of this Bond Obligation is such that if the above  
 bounden Griffon Morris his Heirs Executors or Assignes shall well & truly  
 & justly paym<sup>t</sup> & pay unto the above named Francis Jentend his Heirs Executors  
 or Assignes the just sum or quantity of one thousand five hundred  
 & eighty seven Da halves pounds of good sound merchantable British and  
 foreign tobacco in Casks Contentment in the County aforesaid that then this Bond  
 Obligation to be void of new effect otherwise to stand in full force power  
 & vertue.
