 and the said Richard being indebted in manner aforesaid did upon himself  
 promise & faithfully promise that the aforesaid sum of 1200 to the said William  
 should well & truly content & pay when thereunto required, & that the  
 said Richard has in sum of tobacco to the said William hath not paid though  
 thereunto required for which the said William saith he is damaged  
 the value of 2000 £ of tobacco, & that upon his being & his substance
