This aforesaid Bill being proved, in Rob: King's Attorney for the same in open Court Confess judgment for the same, where the Court granted Order for the ¹⁰ Copy alias Executio

Daniel King of Accomack this day Complaind to the Court of the said John Parker of this County had wrongfully & building upon his Land &c. It is therefore Considered & Ordered by this Court that the said John Parker desist from any further proceeding in building upon the aforesaid Land till the said Kings bounds be known, and when known that four English Men & four Indians be appointed to inspect and view the aforesaid bounds & also to make Report thereof to this Court The Persons by this Court appointed to view the said bounds are Capt. Ben: Hammond, and Rowland Beabins Senior & Junior & Robert Smith. The Persons appointed by the King are Morumsto: James, Mispwadog: Dix, Potomack: Thomas & Ahatsagwa: Wagoquah. to make report ad afo.

Ordered that the Sheriff take into his Custody the: Oxford & that upon his bare back he give him Ten lashes well laid on pursuant to a former Order &c. Executed. Wills
