Michael Turbutt & James Murphoy Esqrs. of all & singular the
 goods Chattels & Credits of Vincent Esqrs late of Talbot County Esq
 was attached to answer unto George Layfield Esq. Plea of trespass of the
 Case etc. — And whereupon the said George by Sam. Worthington his
 Attorney Comd. Date in the year of our Lord 1689 at Manakin
 within the Jurisdiction of this Court a certain Commutation was
 had & made between the said Vincent & the said George where in it was
 agreed between both parties, that whereas the said Vincent had obtained
 Letters of Award to award upon the Estate of Samuel Cooper late of this
 County deceased, whose Estate the said Vincent was indebted unto him the
 sum of nine thousand pounds of tobacco he did assign over unto
 the said George Layfield for a just sum of six thousand five hundred
 pounds in hand paid by and Wm. Blanton Esq. of St. Marys County
 the said Vincent promising to warrant the Debt to be justly due &
 that he had legally obtained the Letters of Award. Now Sam. Cooper
 Esq. of Samuel Cooper and responding what was done by the said
 Vincent then he had illegally obtained Letters of Award to award
 upon the Estate of the said deceased husband whose of right did belong
 to her to do, the said James Esq. of the said Samuel Cooper upon the
 30. day of April 1690 preferred a Petition of Contumacious of the
 Petitioner then sitting at St. Marys Court for the Condition
