In a Court hold for the County of Somerset in the Province of Maryland by the Master
 Justices of the Peace thereunto appointed the 12 day of November in the year 1696.

John Hammond Esq. The 11th day brought the servant Wm Foster before the Court
 William Foster Esq. I humbly complain that the said servant has unlawfully absented
 himself from the said service one year has run away, to which
 run away him the said Foster do openly confess too. Whereupon the said Hammond humbly craves that
 the Court might pass a warrant according to the act of Assembly for the said run away him the said
 being considered & debated by the said Court it was agreed upon and ordered by the Court that
 the said Foster serve the said Master four years faithfully from this time, that to be full satisfaction
 for all indebted him & run away him the said.

David Browne Esq. Somerset County
 George Lenoall Esq. George Lenoall late of this County was attached to answer into the
 Court the said David Browne in a plea that he rendered him the full
 and just sum of two thousand seven hundred seventy & eight
 pounds of tobacco, which he him the said & unjustly detained. And whereupon the said David Browne
 by Edward Jones his Attorney saith that the said George the 3. day of December in the year of Lord
 1685 at Mount in within the Jurisdiction of this Court was indebted unto the said David Browne
 by his certain Bond Obligatory which the said David with the seal of the said George being & there
 into Court the said whereof is the day & year aforesaid at knowledge him self to be indebted to the
 said David, in the sum of two thousand seven hundred seventy & eight pounds of good sound tobacco
 to be paid in the said County. The condition of this above obligation is such that if the above named
 George Lenoall doth pay to the said Browne or over upon a warrant thirteen hundred eighty & nine
 pounds of tobacco every way well qualified, that then said obligation to be void & of no effect other
 ways to stand in full force strength & virtue. At Witness my hand & seal the day & year above
 Written. Nevertheless the said George, the said sum of tobacco, to the said Browne hath not rendered
 but hath put her to deny & still doth deny to the damages of the said Browne of 400 pounds of
 tobacco. And the said George his duty.
