The Indictment being read to whiche his ſaid Haſſett pleade not guilty: Whereupon it was Ordered by the W^t
 Court that Six Peining Women be ſummonsed to enquire into his guilty, it being greatly diſputed his charge
 brought agt the Haſſett to be myſte, and therupon the Sheriff in obedience to the Order returned the ſix
 following persons summoned, who were his wife known to enquire there. And this day hiz / the day aft the
 P^r Grand Summ^d sworn (viz) Lydia Quilliam, Jane Williams, Mary Virgin, Margaret Cary, Talidus Atkinson
 Elizabeth Morris made Return as followeth (viz) Wee being summonsed to enquire concerning the
 ſtud of Elizabeth Osbourne going with Child. Do: find that the ſaid Elizabeth could not concide with Child
 at the time by her mentioned, I go to the time of her delibery — Lydia Quilliam
 Whiche return of the women aforesaid by the W^t Court accepted & recited. Whereupon it was then Ordere


that the Haſſett be cleare & ſhall al liberty from the ſd Baſtard Child to him laid by y^e ſaid Eliz. Osbourne
 further Ordered that Elizabeth Osbourne give ſecurity for her good behabour & ſtay aſſured in this Caſe.
 Whereupon came he & Elizabeth their two Securitors Thomas Bromley & Robert Purdie, and the ſaid
 Elizabeth did acknowledge her ſelf to owe & be indebted unto our Sovereign Lord the King the ſum of fifty
 pounds ſterling money to the ſecuritors in the sum of twenty ſix pounds a piece libe. money and all due
 to be payed on their goods & Chattels lawes & common for the Mates infreſt.

 to alſo pay all Oþers fees in this Caſe expended that ſhoule Recognition to be void, or now offeſſed
