

Richard and William bound themselves jointly by this said Bill notwithstanding the said Richard was
the same to the said Samuel hath not paid, to the damage of the said Samuel of 1500. pounds of
Tobacco, and thereupon he brings his bill &c.

And the Defendant John Worthington his Attorney comes and defends the forced injury for
and saith that true it is was paid a Bill to Sam Handij at request of Martha Cull
wife of Richard Cull, for the payment of the aforesaid quantity of Tobacco expressed in the
said Bill. But the said Samuel declared before we paid this Bill before Breall and ones
that he had expended & laid out 1200 pounds of Tobacco about a bargain that he had
made with Richard Cull concerning a tract of Land, further said that if he did
not make it appear that he had expended so much Tobacco before his own trouble
they should not pay no more but the Charge that he had borne at, upon words
the said Bill was signed, & if the said Handij according to his premises will make
appear that he expended & laid out so much Tobacco was as ready to confess judgment
for what remains unpaid of the said Bill & of this put themselves upon the Court

And the Plaintiff himself on the Court also saith
This Bill binds us Richard Cull Son of Thomas Cull bound & William Duff Plaintiff
of Annapolis in Somerset County in the Province of Maryland, to pay unto Samuel Handij
of the County aforesaid for a valuable consideration in hand already paid, the full & just sum of
seven hundred & fifty pounds of good sound & merchantable Tobacco in Casks in some convenient
place in Annapolis River. the which payment well & truly we made, was and I believe
our said Debtors & should be firmly by this present, to him his heirs or assigns and witnesses
our hands and seals this 24th of November 1692.
