Read Copy of an Order of Somerset County Court, relating to the Pocomoke Indian Land being granted by King
Daniel^r of the Indians of the said Kings Subjects to the said Indians humbly complaining that one John Parker
had intruded within their bounds given them by the Lord Baltimore and perfidiously withdrawn notwithstanding
the said Order of Somerset County Court to the contrary. Whereupon his Ex^r was this day (by advice in Council)
pleased to order as it is here by Ordered, that the Justices of Somerset County Court carefully examine & inquire into
the bounds of the Land given by the Lord Baltimore to the Pocomoke Indians within said County. And that they cause
the bounds thereby to be re-surveyed & run out, and when aforesaid, that publick notice be given to all y^e Inhabitants
of the said County, that they presume not to intrude upon or deal within the said Bounds nor give unlawfull
disturbance to the said Indians therein living, according to the articles of peace with them concluded, and that y^e party
or parties acting or doing contrary be & held bound & ob^r either to the Provincial or County Court to answer & be
ad a disturber of his Masters Peace etc.

His Ex^r Order to the Justices of this Court relating to King Daniels land at Pocomoke given him by
Lord Baltimore, to be resurveyed & run out, & when aforesaid to give Notice to all y^e Inhabitants thereto to
know & be advised thereon etc. was this day read, the said King and twelve of his Subjects great Men being present
and George Smith, Esq^r the W^r Justice of this Court did Order, with the consent of King Daniel &
John Goddins to wh^e Order, the W^r Justice of this Court did Order, with the consent of King Daniel &
John Goddins to wh^e Order, that four Englishmen viz Robert Smith, Rowland Beale
and four Great Men, as it is hereby Ordered, viz That four Englishmen viz Robert Smith, Rowland Beale
Simon Jones and George Smith, do attend the said King & Great Men four days after the date hereof to
resurvey or lay out the aforesaid Bounds pursuant to his Ex^r Order. And that the said English and Indians so
ordered are to make Report of their proceeding herein, to our Justice the second day of our next County
Court to be held in Aug^r next. The One and Two and Three and Four

Leonard Jones Jun^r of the said County & James Hobl^r of the said County were attached to
James & Will D^r of the said County & James Hobl^r of the said County of a place of trespass
of the said John and who upon his said Complaint by Sam Worthington
the Attorney Com^r d saith that he wrote the said James on or about the 10th day of August in the year of our Lord
God 1694. at Wicomico within the Jurisdiction of this Court became indebted unto the said Leonard in y^e sum
of one pound fifteen shillings Sterling, it being for fifteen days of work & his daily wages for
wh^e he say^r to have done reasonably debred fifteen p^s & down white his eight pence & Gates for
one hundred & ten shillings of one pound fifteen shillings as he aforesaid in Court appeared. And the said
James being indebted in manner and form as aforesaid, did upon his self afform & faithfully promise that the
