By the Ex^{ty} the Govern^r of Council the 15th May 1696.
Read Copy of an Order of Somerset County Court relating to the Decemets Indian Land being granted by King
Demis^l & others of the Kings Subjects. The said Indians humbly complaining that one John Parker
had intruded within their bounds given them by the Lord Baltimore and persisted therein notwithstanding
the said Order of Somerset County Court to the contrary. Whereupon the Ex^{ty} was this day (by advice in Council)
pleas'd to order as it is here by Order, that the Justices of Somerset County Court do carefully examine & inquire into
the bounds of the Land given by the Lord Baltimore to the Decemets Indian within the said County. And that they cause
the bounds thereof to be re-surveyed & run out, and when ascertained that publick notice be given to all y^e Inhabitants
& others of the said County, that they presume not to encroach upon or deal within the said bounds nor give unlawfull
disturbance to the said Indians therein living, according to the Articles of peace with them concluded and that y^e party
or parties acting or doing contrary be forthwith bound over, either to the Probintial or County Court to answer y^e same
as a disturber of the Matters Tract &c. Signed by Order. Hen. Boulton Esq. Clerk

The Ex^{ty} Order to the Justices of the Court relating to King Demis^l Land at Pocomet given him by
Lord Baltimore, to be re-surveyed & run out, & when ascertained to give Notice to all y^e Inhabitants therein not to
encroach or deal therein the said day read, the said King and twelve of his Subjects great Men being present
In Obedience to whose Order, the Justices of the Court did Order, with free consent of King Demis^l &
his four great Men, as it is hereby ordered vizt That four Englishmen (vizt) Robert Smith, Rowland Beabins
Samuel Jind and George Erwith, do attend the said King & great Men fourty days after the date hereof to
re-survey or lay out the aforesaid bounds pursuant to the Ex^{ty} Order. And that the said English and Indians do
Orderd are to make Report of their proceedings herein, to our Justices the second day of our next County
Court to be held in August. the said

Leonard Jones Jun^r the Somerset County sh. was James Morill of this County was attached to
James Nevill Esq. } answer unto Leonard Jones Jun^r of the same County of a plea of trespass
of the Case &c. and did whereupon the said Leonard by Sam^l Worthington
his Attorney Com^r & saith that whereas the said James once about the 10th day of August in the year of our Lord
God 1694. at Wiscamsco. with in the Jurisdiction of this Court became indebted unto the said Leonard in y^e just
Sum of one pound fifteen shilling Sterling, it being for fifteen galls of Carr shoddy days work for
which he sayeth he doth reasonably deserve fifteen pence & did when with the said Jones & Galt for y^e
said amount to the said sum of one pound fifteen shilling and y^e said sum in Court appeared. And the said
James being indebted in manner and form as aforesaid did upon himself assume & faithfully promise that the
