that Court and on manor River according to the order of assembly with the charges of a suit of law now days
ending in Court on demand firmly and truly by the said person as witness my hand this 14th of August anno

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And the Defendant Pirrie in the Bond aforesaid mentioned in the proper person comes into Court and says
that the Debt in the said Declaration to be just and true therefore it is considered by the Court that
that the said William Whittington Sheriff of the County of Somerset aforesaid against the Defendant as well the sum of seven
thousand pounds of good Tobacco in the Declaration mentioned as also the sum of
pounds of tobacco for his cost of suit in his behalf laid out &
expended and the Defendant in mercy

Somerset to Dorwick Fleming was attached to consider unto William
Whittington Sheriff of Somerset County of a plea that he render unto him
just sum of seven thousand pounds of tobacco which from him he unjustly detained and whereupon
the said William Whittington in attorney complains that the said Dorwick on the 13th day of
June in the year of our Lord 1694 at Docomote within the Jurisdiction of this Court by his certain and
obligatory with condition therein annexed which the said William signed & sealed with the seal of the
said Court and being then in Court the date whereof is the day & year aforesaid wherein he became
indebted unto the said William in the penal sum of seven thousand pounds of good Tobacco in that
to be paid to the said William in hand & to which payment well and truly to be made & done the
said Dorwick bound himself jointly and severally with Robert Pirrie Edward Green and Richard Tull
do not notwithstanding the said Dorwick nor Robert Pirrie the aforesaid sum of Tobacco to the said William
hath not paid to the said William of eight thousand pounds of good Tobacco and thereupon
he brings this suit & Whittington & of plea & John Doe Richard Roe

And it is known unto all men by these presents that was Robert Pirrie Edward
Green Dorwick Fleming and Richard Tull all of the County of Somerset in the Province aforesaid
do owe and justly stand indebted unto William Whittington Sheriff of the County aforesaid in the penal sum
of seven thousand pounds of good Tobacco to be paid to the said William Whittington his heirs & assigns
and should lawfully in the County aforesaid which payment well and truly to be made & done as said
and deliver our heirs & assigns and every of them jointly and severally for and in the whole
firmly by these presents and have hereunto affixed our hands & seals this 13th day of June anno
1696

Witness the aforesaid Robert Pirrie was lately taken in execution for the satisfying of a certain
Debt and charges on the suit & by Mr John West Clerk of the County Court & then the said Pirrie
together with the aforesaid mentioned Edward Green did enter into a bond as well to save keep harmless
and indemnify the said William Whittington of and from all troubles and Innuencances which
him might accrue for or by his the said Pirrie having in his hands as also for his appearance at
a Court held the second Tuesday of June Instant at the Dredging Creek when and where it was
